Subject: Community Choice Aggregation Presentation: PG&E

Discussion:

PG&E has requested to be on the agenda for Tuesday afternoon's meeting in an effort to clarify what they feel may be misconceptions or unclear points with regard to Community Choice Aggregation. Representatives from PG&E will be in attendance Tuesday to provide a presentation that will discuss CCA from PG&E's perspective. In the past, generally, Kings River Conservation District has led the presentation. This time, members of KRCD will be in attendance to answer any questions that might arise, however, will not be a part of the presentation.

Additionally, Council had asked staff to update them on the status of CCA participants. To date, Hanford, Kings County and Kerman have officially signed on as members of the San Joaquin Valley Power Authority. Once 9 agencies have signed on, the program will go forward. Attached is the most current schedule of Cities that have joined CCA and the other upcoming voting dates.

David Orth, General Manager of KRCD, has provided some information at Council's request (attached here) regarding the CCA program and how the proposed 500 MW power plant would affect the program feasibility and also addresses further the issue of exit fees.

Representatives from the Lemoore Union Elementary School District, Lemoore Union High School District, and at least one large local industrial entity are expected to be in attendance as well.

Finally, you all received a copy of the CPUC approved Implementation Plan last week. I hope you were able to make it through all 77 pages. Dave Orth will be able to answer any questions you have regarding the Implementation process.

Staff proposes to bring the issue of officially joining the CCA before the Council for a vote on June 19th. By that time, we will have updated the list of participating cities and counties that have signed on. The 90-day window to sign on to CCA began on May 4, 2007 with the delivery of Program Agreement 1.
