3. ** Brutia Pine	Pinus Halepensis Brutia'	E	30'-60' 25' spread	Moderate, columnar 3", oval to oblong. Thrives in desert heat.	No	Yes
4. **Canary Island Pine	Pinus Canariensis	E	60' - 80', columnar	At maturity, a round-crowned tree. Cones 4"-9", oval, glossy brown.	No	Yes
5. **Chinese Pistache	Pistacia Chinesis	D	60', 50' spread	Leaves 10-6 paired leaflets. Striking fall foliage color. Stake and prune young trees to develop a head high enough to walk under.	Yes	Yes
6. Coast Live Oak	Quercus Agrifolia	E	30' - 70', greater spread	Round-headed, wide spreading. Dense foliage of rounded, holly-like leaves.	Yes	Yes
7. **Crape Myrtle	Lagerstroemia Indica	D	6' - 30', equal spread	Deep, glossy green leaves. Fall foliage yellow, orange to red. Long flowering period. July-September	No	Yes
8. Evergreen Pear	Pyrus Kawakamii	D	15'-25', 20'	Leaves glossy, oval	Yes	Yes
9. **Golden Rain	Koelreuteria Paniculata	D	20' - 30'	Open, branching, yellow flowers, seed pods	Yes	Yes
10. Grecian Laurel	Laurus Nobilis	E	20'-25', 15' spread	Slow grower. Leaves leathery, aromatic. In hot summer climates, best in filtered shade.	Yes	Yes

11. **Holly Oak	Quercus Ilex	E	40'-70', equal spread	Moderate growth rate. Leaves variable in shape and size.	Yes	Yes
12. Italian Stone Pine	Pinus Pinea	E	40'-80', equal spread	Takes heat and drought. Cones: 4"-6", glossy	No	Yes
13. Maidenhair Tree	Ginko Biloba	D	35'-50', lesser spread	Leaves light green, broad fan-shaped. Plant only male trees. Female produces messy, ill-smelling fruits.	Yes	Yes
14. Pepperidge Tupelo	Nyssa Sylvatica	D	30'-50'	Deciduous, moderate growth. One of the best fall color trees.	Yes	Yes
15. Pin Oak	Quercus Palustris	D	50' +	Moderate to fast grower. (50-80') Good range of fall color.	Yes	Yes
16. Red Oak	Quercus Rubra	D	50' +	Fast grower. Red leaves in fall.	Yes	Yes
17. Sawleaf Zelkova	Zelkova Serrata	D	60', equal spread	Leaves similar to those of an elm. Very pest-free.	Yes	Yes
18. Shamel Ash	Fraxinus Uhdei "Majestic Beauty"	D	40'-60', lesser spread	5"-9" glossy, dark green leaflets. Shallow rooted, encourage deeper rooting by deeper waterings.	No	Yes
19. Sweet Gum	Liquidamber Styraciflua	D	To 60', 20'-25' spread	Leaves deep green turning purple, yellow or red in fall. Hanging seed pots in winter.	No	Yes
20. **Valley Oak	Quercus Lobata	D	60'-80' spread	Native to San Joaquin Valley. Deep rooted. Drought tolerant.	No	Yes
