

The Family

Aaron and Sarah Mooney came to Lemoore with their daughter Harriet in 1875. Aaron prospered as the proprietor of the general store and served as Lemoore's undertaker. Sarah and Harriet were very active in civic affairs. In 1893 the Mooneys built their Victorian home.



Upon her death in 1925, Sarah left the home to her granddaughter, Marie Bailey Blakeley. For the next 50 years, as a rental, it provided housing for many local citizens. The Blakeley family wanted this property to stand in memory of their grandmother Sarah. In 1973 they donated the property to the Lemoore District Chamber of Commerce to be used as a memorial museum.

This beautiful Victorian home is suitably furnished for the period. Most of the artifacts have been donated by various Lemoore families and Mooney descendants.

Artifacts and Out-Buildings

There are wonderful permanent displays of furniture, pre-electric and early electric appliances for functional and recreational use. The Library is a wealth of information about the San Joaquin Valley. Displays change throughout the year to feature historic collections including wearing apparel, school supplies, cookware and other items too wonderful to be kept in storage and away from public view. You'll want to visit often so you won't miss anything.



Located on the Museum grounds is the old brick outhouse that has been plumbed and still serves as the restroom. It is reputed to be the only brick structure of this nature still in use.

The museum recently acquired a "Road Wagon" that one of our early citizens, Mr. Tibbert Shore, used to haul freight in Lemoore in the 1890s. It is not unlike Mr. Mooney's own multipurpose wagon -- and sometimes hearse. It will be displayed in the drive-through carriage house located near the rear of the property. This building also housed Mr. Mooney's office and, more recently, the Lemoore Chamber of Commerce headquarters.

There are plans to restore the carriage house to its original glory with help from the community and other friends of the museum.

Museum Events

Fundraising events throughout the year provide everyone with opportunity to help preserve local history. Join us for the annual Museum Barbecue in the Spring and the Olde Fashioned Rummage Sale in the Fall. Holiday celebrations begin with the Christmas Home Tour in early December when generous members of the community open their decorated homes to benefit the museum.

The museum grounds are a wonderful place to wile away an afternoon. They are available to rent for weddings, receptions and other special occasions.

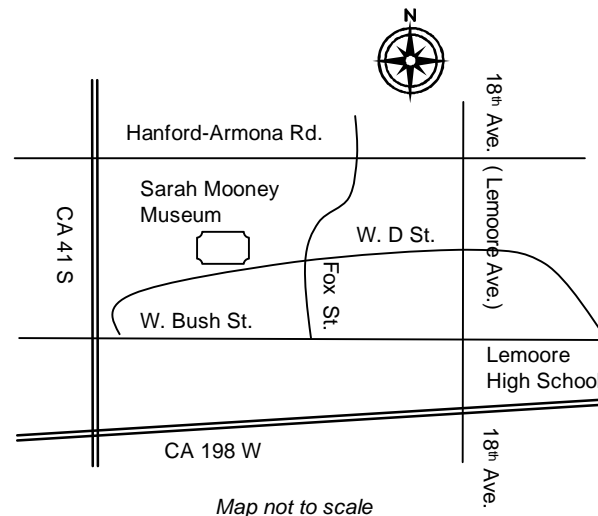
is a Non-Profit Organization
